

Wedding Ring Options

(It is important that the bride and groom, each, say the same vow to one other in turn, claiming for the marriage a vision and hope to be mutually honored by both husband and wife. The statements below are written as if the groom is saying them; simply exchange words such as husband/wife for the other to change the vow so it is appropriate for the bride to say.)

_____, I offer you this ring, a symbol of my enduring love and faithfulness. I ask that you accept it and wear it as a symbol of my commitment to you and our relationship in marriage.

With this ring, I _____, commit to thee _____, to be your wedded husband, to have and to hold from this day forward, for better for worse, for richer for poorer, in sickness and in health, to love and to cherish, till death us do part, according to God's holy ordinance.
