RESOLUTION CONCERNING SUPPORT FOR A NON-VIOLENT END TO APARTHEID IN SOUTH AFRICA

WHEREAS, the thoughts and prayers of all Christians must be with the suffering peoples of South

WHEREAS, the system of apartheid is brutal, violent and dehumanizing; and

WHEREAS, the efforts of our church should be directed toward establishing a society of peace and justice in South Africa; and

WHEREAS, these efforts are defeated if the means used to oppose apartheid are themselves brutal, violent and dehumanizing, and contribute to the misery and suffering of South Africa's

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the General Assembly of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) declare its support for all efforts to establish peace and justice in South Africa through nonviolent means; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the General Assembly of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) stand opposed to the use of Basic Mission Finance funds for the support or subsidization of any group or groups known to engage in acts of violence or terror against civilians.

The General Board recommends that the General Assembly NOT ADOPT Resolution No. 8748 for the following reasons:

- 1. The resolution assumes that organizations that are opposed to be a second apartheid can have a one-dimensional agenda, in the face of one of the most violent governments in the world.
- 2. Third world groups engaged in liberation struggles against oppressive regimes cannot overcome oppression in ways that leave God's children wide open to slaughter.
- 3. The resolution fails to recognize that the grant of the Divison of Overseas Ministries was to the World Council of Churchs' Program to Combat Racism, to be administered to Southern African groups for human needs, not to promote violence. protocode of especializations
